It might be better to share the video with staff and let them know that re-posting on personal social media is encouraged as the action rather then asking them to do a data call on the amount of followers thay have.

Once we start blending work media accounts and personal media accounts this can be problematic. For example what if their Reddit postings (or any others for that matter) might be controversial from what NIST or .gov would approve? Is PAO going to clear the Reddit first and what would that mean? Is there an implied or even direct endorsement of that page by NIST? These are all difficult questions that come into play once we go down this path.
